



Ride your bike or scooter to the Whitewater Festival and park it in the 'Gear Storage' area. This will be a secure location staffed by volunteers from the Cañon City Piranhas swim team (donations accepted). Find the storage area in the basketball court area at Centennial Park - located at the westernmost portion of the park. Bring your own lock for added security.

Event participants: You can also store paddle boards and kayaks in between events. You'll recieve a tag for each item which will be required to check the items back out. **Bring your own lock for added security.** Volunteers will monitor the fenced area and facilitate check in / check out.

WHITEWATER AMBASSADOR

2023 AMBASSADOR - KYLE HORNE

Kyle moved to Cañon City in 1996 to become the Voice of the Cañon City Tigers and sports broadcaster at KRLN/ KSTY radio station. His love for the community grew, as did his family. He knew he wanted to raise his son in Cañon City because of the people and their generous spirit.

During Kyle's first years as the Cañon City Area Recreation and Park District's Programs Director in 2008, they hosted Riverwalk Games involving kickball, sand volleyball, flag football, and river activities. Later, upon success of some river events and coordination with community partners, the Whitewater Festival was born. Without the funds from the Whitewater Festival, the whitewater structures and the river improvements would have taken longer to establish. In the early days of the Whitewater Festival, Kyle ran around with his headset on to ensure the success of all aspects of the event. He was usually the first person to arrive and one of the last persons to leave.

His goal was for the citizens of this community to have a great time celebrating and enjoying a time of friendship and music. Now, he volunteers and has a great time announcing the Guide

Auction and watching the carnage of the Build Your Own Boat Race and the Raft Rodeo. He strongly believes Cañon City deserves opportunities to grow and cherish outdoor activities. Kyle never wants recognition for his contribution.

He often says, "It's not about me. It's about the project." He would be the first to insist the festival succeeds because it takes everyone to do their part, from organizers, volunteers, vendors, and participants became a passion.

WHITEWATER EVENTS

BEGINNER / FAMILY FUN

Join in on the fun! These events are designed for those who are interested in participating in a non-competetive event or an event that requires little experience on the water. Note that children should be accompanied by an adult, and the ability to swim is required. Day-of registration is available. See the registration tent at the center of Centennial Park. Please note that Colorado law requires that all occupants of an inner tube, air mattress, or similar device must wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved type (, III, or V PFD (pesonal flotation device). All persons under the age of 13 swimming in the Arkansas River within the AHRA must wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved PFD. All event participants must wear a PFD.

FRIDAY

RIVER PLAY WAVE DEMOS

4:00 pm - Play Wave

Show off your SUP, kayak, raft or duckle skills on the Centennial Park play wave. Try a demo board or boat from River Station Gear (located in downtown Cañon City).

ALL HANDS ON DECK!

5:15 pm

Anything in town that floats, get on the water! Bring your SUP, your tube, your floatie, your canoe, your barrel, your store-bought raft, BRING ANYTHING! This is a show of force. Get on the river and show the town how many people float.

SATURDAY

BUILD YOUR OWN BOAT (BYOB)

5:30 pm

Show off your craftsmanship and engineering skills in this crowd favorite event! First place is awarded a pure gold coin (\$1000 value) donated by Cañon Signature Mortgage, and cash prizes awarded to second and third place.

If you love playing in the river - from boating to SUPing to floating in an inflatable kayak - these events are for you! The following events are suggested for those with experience on the river. Registration fees apply and vary by event. Please see the festival website for registration information. Registration for most events is available on the day-of at the registration tent at the center of the park. Please note that Colorado law requires that all occupants of an inner tube, air mattress, or similar device must wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved type I, III, or V PFD (pesonal flotation device). All persons under the age of 13 swimming in the Arkansas River within the AHRA must wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved PFD.

SATURDAY

RAFTING HEAD 2 HEAD

2:00 pm

Two rafts start at the same time. You must go around one buoy on each side of the river. First one to finish moves on to the next round. Tournament style scoring.

KAYAK HEAD 2 HEAD RACE

2:00 pm

Kayaks will start at the same time, each kayak must navigate around a buoy on each side of the river. Enough sign ups will turn this into a tournament with multiple heats.

RMR STORM HEAD 2 HEAD - R2

2:00 pm

Two rafts start at the same time. You must go around one buoy on each side of the river. First one to finish moves on to the next round. Tournament style scoring.

RAFT RODEO

6:15 pm

The classic Whitewater Festival event. Who can control the wave? Will be judged by the crowed and a neutral panel of judges who use established criteria. Located at the lower feature in Centennial Park. Winners recieve a beatiful custom RGWWF belt buckle.

SUP HEAD 2 HEAD RACE

2:00 pm

This is a mass start event. Competitors will navigate around two buoys, one on each side of the river. If enough sign up, this will become a tournament.

DUCKIE DASH HEAD 2 HEAD

2:00 pm

Grab your inflatable duckie (or borrow one) and head down the slalom course from 1st street to Centennial Park. Battle head-to-head with others. Must be at least 10 years old to participate in this event.

SURFING COMPETITION

5:00 pm

Can you surf the features in the Centennial Park? Boogle Boards, Surf Boards. This is not the raft surfing competition.

TRAIL EVENTS BEGINNER / INTERMEDIATE / ADVANCED

Not ready to get wet? Join a land-based trail event on foot or on a bike. Running and biking events all leave from Centennial park and utilized adjacent trails, including the Riverwalk and South Cañon Trails.

Events are designed for varied ages and abilities - there's something for everyone! All events are on Saturday, July 22. The Great Escape Trail Events is a 1% for Trails contributor - giving back to local trails!

BEGINNER

PIZZA MADNESS 5K TRAIL RUN

Saturday, 7:45 am

This course leaves from Centennial Park and travels along the Arkansas Riverwalk trail. You'll cross over the river at the pedestrian bridge, head toward Tunnel Drive, and turn around at the Trailhead (or go up the hill for a beautiful view and a little extra elevation gain). Return to the park for a nice, easy second half and post-run celebration at the park.

COMING HOME REALTY 5K BEGINNER / FAMILY MTB RIDE

Saturday, 9:45 am

Bring the kiddos! Try a mountain bike event for the first time! This course follows the Arkansas Riverwalk west to Tunnel Drive and has very little elevation gain. Youth as young as 6 years old may enjoy this course (our younger on a bike seat), and kids as young as 10 are welcome to ride solo. This course leaves from Centennial Park and travels along the Arkansas Riverwalk trail to the trailhead at Tunnel Drive, Turn around at the trailhead.

PIZZA MADNESS 10K TRAIL RUN

Saturday, 7:45 am

You'll experience the best of lower South Cañon on this beautiful run. Leave from Centennial Park, climb up Wagon Trail, then make a hard right to climb all of Schepp Ridge for views of the town, mountains, and the Ecology Park. At the end of Schepp Ridge, you'll use Piñon Trail to merge onto Recycle. You'll start your descent on Mutton Bustin', where you'll then return to Centennial Park to awaiting spectators.

COMING HOME REALTY 10K MTB RIDE

Saturday, 9:30 am

Intermediate-level riders with the ability to navigate some technical elements will enjoy this fun and fast 6-mile course. Leave from Centennial Park, climb up Wagon Trail, then make a hard right to climb all of Schepp Ridge for views of the town, mountains, and the Ecology Park. At the end of Schepp Ridge, you'll use Piñon Trail to merge onto Recycle. You'll start your descent on Mutton Bustin', where you'll then return to Centennial Park to awaiting spectators.



3 ROCKS ENGINEERING 27K GRINDER

Saturday, 7:30 am

Love a good uphill grind and downhill fun? From Centennial Park, you'll take crusher fine trails and some singletrack to pick up Temple Canyon Road near the Ecology Park. Head up this glorious gravel route to the top of Cañon City's local favorite descending trail - The Great Escape, for miles of techy downhill fun. You'll head back on Temple Canyon Road (where you MUST meet the 9:15 cuttoff to re-enter the singletrack course) and enjoy more flowy, fun downhill on Schepp's Ridge, Recycle, and Mutton Bustin.' You'll end up back at Centennial Park for a well-deserved break and beverage.

OUR ARKANSAS RIVER

OUR HISTORY AND OUR FUTURE



BRIDGING THE GAP TO A FUTURE OF SAFE AND FUN RECREATION

The Arkansas river is for everyone, and recent river restoration projects (including one funded by Great Outdoors Colorado in 2018) have helped our community live this truth. Cañon City's industrial history shaped the current path of the river and inhibited its natural ebbing, flooding and meandering. Previous generations collectively erected a levee on both the left and right banks, taming what was once a wild river. This act, though necessary for the survival of Cañon City, used discarded concrete, bricks and metal to reinforce the banks. These locations eventually

became industrial dumping grounds, and community refuse was often discarded on the banks of the river. Access to the river was often steep and difficult, jagged metal stuck out of the river bottom, and debris could snag those who braved the waters. For decades these environmentally unsound practices continued.

In 2007 three local community members had a vision to correct the honest but naive mistakes of the past. Beth Katchmar, Larry Oddo, and Will Colon sat along the river bank in Centennial Park and devised a vision for the future: a section of river through the heart of Cañon City that would allow safe and enjoyable recreational access. Their group - the Whitewater Kayak and Recreation park (WKRP) - presented the first Whitewater Festival. With additional help from the Cañon City Recreation District and many others, the festival proceeds were put toward WKRP's goal. They brought their inspiration to the City and soon the first bank restoration and surf waves were complete. Work continues on this important downtown corridor, and there's more to come!

Since 2019, Royal Gorge Rio has continued to advocate for the health and safety of the Arkansas river corridor through Fremont county. There is still so much potential on the banks of the Arkansas. They aim to rehabilitate areas innundated with historic industrial waste, and also reinforce the healthy native and natural riparian areas. With the help our community, we will make the river corridor safe for everyone: walkers, waders, anglers, hikers, bikers, kayakers, tubers, rafters, swimmers, surfers.

ARKANSAS HEADWATERS RECREATION AREA

The Arkansas Headwaters Recreation Area (AHRA) that we know today, stretches over 152 miles of river corridor and sees over one million visitors per year, a number that continues to grow. The AHRA is recognized as one of the nation's most popular whitewater rafting and kayaking locations and is home to a world-class fishery. The Arkansas Headwaters Recreation Area is a cooperative effort between Colorado Parks & Wildlife (CPW), the US Bureau of Land Management (BLM), and the US Forest Service (USFS). Through this partnership, we provide visitors with outstanding recreation opportunities and care for the natural resources of the Upper Arkansas River Valley.

In 2024, AHRA, along with local partners, Cañon City Schools and RG Rio, worked together to engage with the third graders of Canon City and introduce the "Every Kid in a PFD" program. Students received classroom education on the importance of life jackets, self-rescue, hazard identification, and river ethics and were given a free personal flotation device (PFD) to keep. In total this year, 281 PFDs were given out to third graders in 6 different Canon City schools. When students outgrow their first life jacket, they can trade it in for an adult universal life jacket to continue to float them into adulthood.

This program is designed to provide life-saving education and equipment to young Coloradans throughout the State's most popular river recreation watershed. We encourage students to take an active role in their safety and the safety of those around them.


